

PUBLIC NOTICE

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that on 22 September 2020 Wolverhampton City Council made the following Orders under Sections 1, 2, 3, 84 and 124(1)(d) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984. The effect of the Orders which come into operation on 24 September 2020 are as follows:

1. The Wolverhampton City Council (Penn) (Prohibition and Restriction of Waiting and Street Parking Places) (Amendment No 10) Order 2019

This Order will prohibit any vehicle to wait at any time on any day and to load and unload at any time on any day in parts of Ashland Street, Elias Mattu Avenue, Great Brickkiln Street, Humber Road, Kimberley Street and Rosebery Street. This Order will prohibit any vehicle to wait at any time on any day in parts of Ashland Street, Elias Mattu Avenue, Pelham Street, Rosebery Street and Salisbury Street.

Existing traffic regulation orders will be revoked to the extent necessary to facilitate the provisions of this Order.

2. The Wolverhampton City Council (Elias Mattu Avenue) (20 mph Speed Limit) Order 2019

This Order will prohibit any person from driving any vehicle with a maximum speed exceeding 20 miles per hour on the lengths of roads specified in the Schedule below:

SCHEDULE

- (i) Elias Mattu Avenue In its entirety from its junction with Kimberley Street, Pelham Street/Ashland Street, Great Brickkiln Street.

3. The Wolverhampton City Council (Elias Mattu Avenue) (Prohibition of Driving for all Motor Vehicles) Order 2019

This Order will prohibit any motor vehicle to proceed along that length of road as specified in the Schedule below :

SCHEDULE

- (i) Elias Mattu Avenue From a point 110 metres east of the eastern kerb line of Kimberley Street for a distance of 4 metres in an eastern direction.

The Borough of Wolverhampton Prohibition of Driving Order 1982 is to be revoked.

The prohibition in this Order shall not apply to cycles.

4. The Wolverhampton City Council (Penn) (Prohibition and Restriction of Waiting and Street Parking Places) (Amendment No 11) Order 2019

This Order will prohibit any vehicle to wait at any time on any day and to load and unload at any time on any day in parts of Langley Road, Fareham Crescent and Highclere Gardens.

Existing traffic regulation orders will be revoked to the extent necessary to facilitate the provisions of this Order.

5. The Wolverhampton City Council (Wednesfield) (Prohibition and Restriction of Waiting and Street Parking Places) (Amendment No 13) Order 2019

This Order will prohibit any vehicle to wait at any time on any day and to load and unload at any time on any day in parts of Springfield Road, Bakewell Gardens and Badger Croft.

6. The Wolverhampton City Council (Bakewell Gardens and Badger Croft) (20mph Speed Limit) Order 2019

This Order will prohibit any person from driving any vehicle with a maximum speed exceeding 20 miles per hour on the lengths of roads specified in the Schedule below:

SCHEDULE

- (i) Bakewell Gardens In its entirety from its junctions with Badger Croft and Springfield Road.
(ii) Badger Croft In its entirety from its junction with Bakewell Gardens.

7. The Wolverhampton City Council (Bilston) (Prohibition and Restriction of Waiting and Street Parking Places) (Amendment No 12) Order 2019

This Order will prohibit any vehicle to wait at any time on any day in parts of Steelhouse Lane, Cable Street, Furnace Drive and Forge Road.

8. The Wolverhampton City Council (Chain Gardens, Forge Road, Furnace Drive, William Bayliss Drive Area) (20mph Speed Limit) Order 2019

This Order will prohibit any person from driving any vehicle with a maximum speed exceeding 20 miles per hour on the lengths of road specified in the Schedule below:

SCHEDULE

- (i) Chain Gardens In its entirety from its junction with William Bayliss Drive
(ii) Forge Road In its entirety from its junctions with Furnace Drive, Steelhouse Lane and William Bayliss Drive
(iii) Furnace Drive In its entirety from its junctions with Forge Road and Cable Street
(iv) William Bayliss Drive In its entirety from its junctions with Chain Gardens and Forge Road.

Any person who wishes to question the validity of the Order(s), on the ground(s) that it is not within the powers of the relevant section of the Act or on the ground(s) that any requirement of those sections of the Act or of Parts I to III of Schedule 9 to the Act or any regulation under the said Part III has not been complied with may, within six weeks of 22 September 2020 make application for the purpose to the High Court.
