



4. Nothing in Article 3 shall render it unlawful to cause or permit any vehicle to wait on the roads specified therein for so long as may be necessary to enable –
- (a) a person to board or alight from the vehicle;
  - (b) the vehicle, if it cannot be conveniently used for such purposes in any other road, to be used in connection with any of the following operations, namely –
    - (i) building, industrial or demolition operations;
    - (ii) the removal of any obstruction to traffic;
    - (iii) the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of the said roads;
    - (iv) the laying, erection, alteration or repair in or on land adjacent to the said lengths of roads or any sewer or of any main, pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity or of any telecommunications apparatus as defined in the Telecommunications Act 1984; and
    - (v) the vehicle, if it cannot be conveniently used for such purpose in any other road, to be used in the service of a local authority or its contractors in pursuance of that authority's statutory powers or duties.
  - (c) the vehicle, in the service of Royal Mail or other universal provider (as defined in Section 4(3) and (4) of the Postal Services Act 2000), to be used for the purpose of delivering and/or collecting mail.
5. Existing traffic regulation orders are hereby revoked to the extent necessary to facilitate the provisions of this Order.
